

bushes, and lays four to five eggs, very like those of the common canary.




FIG. 37.—Group of Rock-hoppers, Inaccessible Island. (From a photograph.)

Beyond the garden the tussock-grass of the Tristan group, which is *Spartina arundinacea*—not *Dactylis cespitosa*, the well-known tussock-grass of the Falklands—forms a dense jungle. The root-clumps, or “tussocks,” are two or three feet in
