

belknapi, from the North Pacific, lat. $53^{\circ} 8' N.$, long. $171^{\circ} 19' W.$, 1006 fathoms, black sand and shells, bottom temperature $35^{\circ} \cdot 5 F.$ We are now in a position to state that *Leptochiton alveolus* is found in the North Pacific at great depths as far south as lat. $16^{\circ} 42' N.$

"*Placiphora setiger*, King, was found at a depth of 345 fathoms, blue mud, bottom temperature 46° , Station 306A; and *Euplaciphora simplex*, Carp. MS., was collected on the shore, and dredged from 110 fathoms at Tristan da Cunha."
