Excluding Protozoa, over 20 specimens of invertebrates and fishes were obtained at this Station, belonging to about 16 species, of which 10 are new to science, including representatives of 4 new genera; 7 of the new species and 1 new genus were not obtained elsewhere.

There were many worm-tubes among the pumice-stones, and the trawl-net was covered by the branching Rhizopod *Rhizammina algæformis*. Many of the pumice-stones were coated with manganese, and to them were attached specimens of *Stephanoscyphus*.
