The following are recorded in the note-books :—*Rhizosolenia* (with *Vorticella* attached) and other Diatoms, spores of an Alga, Siphonophoræ, Echinoderm larvæ, *Balanoglossus* larvæ, Planarian larvæ, Copepods, Zoëæ, Pteropods, *Appendicularia*. A sword-fish about five feet long was seen to jump out of the water alongside the ship when leaving the harbour.

**Station 219** (Sounding 357), Admiralty Islands to Yokohama (see Chart 34).

STATION 219.

March 10, 1875 ; lat. 1° 54' S., long. 146° 39' 40" E.

Temperature of air at noon, 84°·8 ; mean for the day, 81°·7.

Temperature of water at surface, 84°·0.

Density at 60° F. at surface, 1·02571.

Depth, 150 fathoms ; deposit, Coral Mud.

At 1 P.M. got up steam. At 3.30 P.M. weighed anchor and proceeded out of Nares Harbour. At 4 P.M. suddenly found shoal water ; stopped. At 4.15 P.M. proceeded, having passed over a  $3\frac{3}{4}$  fathoms coral patch. At 4.45 P.M. stopped and sounded in 150 fathoms, a short distance outside Nares Harbour. Put over trawl, which came up at 5.30 P.M. with many specimens. At 6 P.M. proceeded under steam and sail.
