The tow-nets on December 11 and 12 gave large quantities of small blue Salpæ, along with Diatoms, Globigerina, Orbulina, Acanthometræ, Infusoria, &c. Whales and porpoises were seen; two whales were observed to cross the mouth of Valparaiso Harbour in company, the smaller one of which came to the surface at intervals of about two hundred yards and rose right out of the water, sometimes exposing fully two-thirds of its body, when it gave a half turn and fell usually on its back or side, making a tremendous splash; this it did about half a dozen times, mostly in the same manner.
