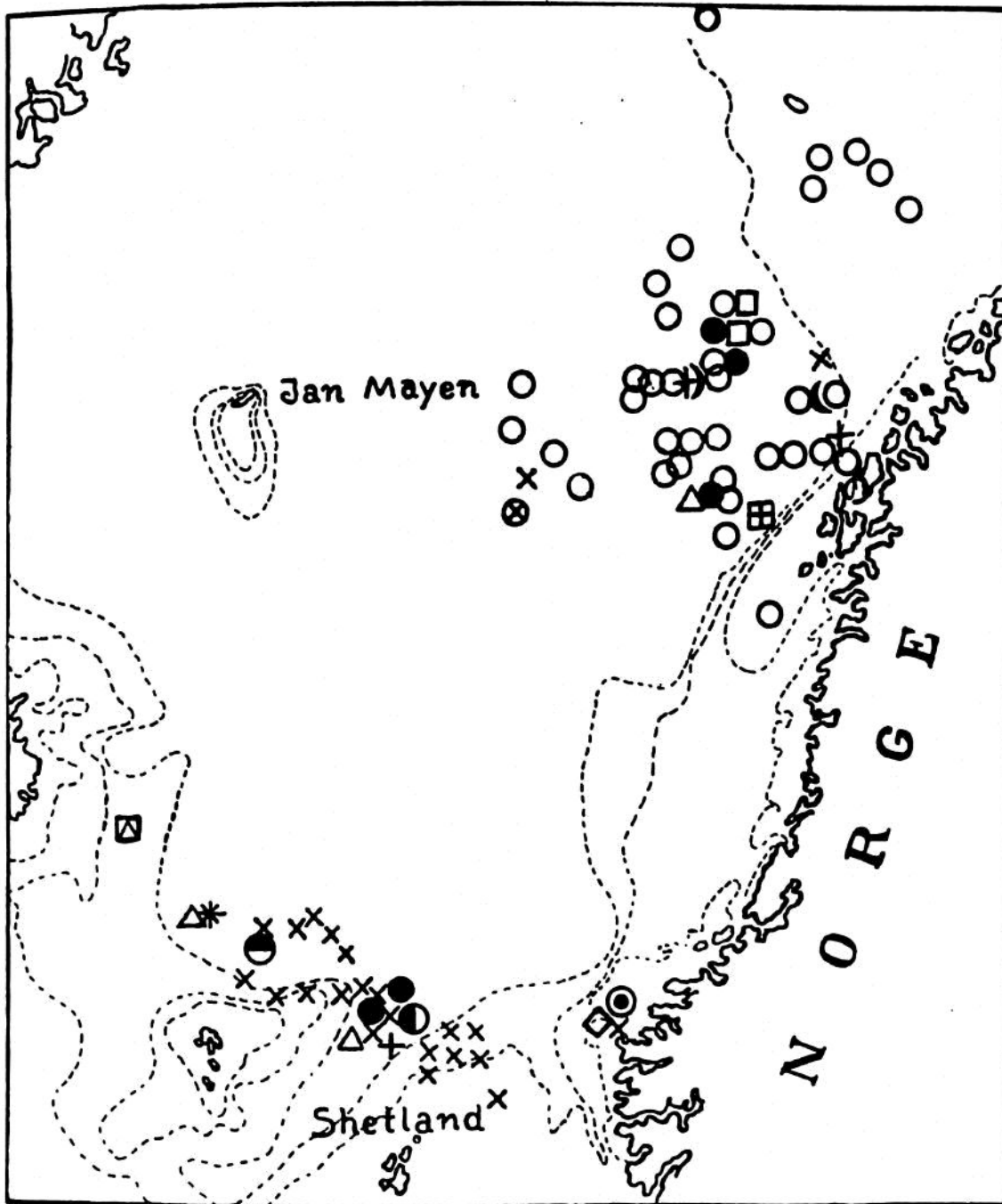


FIG. 482.—ANIMALS CAUGHT OVER GREAT DEPTHS IN THE NORWEGIAN SEA.
