The direct descendants of such a form are probably the genera Cynthia and Microcosmus, while from this stem two side branches have arisen, one (E.) resulting in the ancestors of the family of the Molgulidæ, and the other by the development of a peduncle (8), leading to the Bolteninæ, and especially to the genus Boltenia—Culeolus and Fungulus being comparatively recent modifications (9).

E. is a modified Cynthiad form, in which the interstigmatic vessels have become curved and probably spirally coiled, so that the branchial sac has the structure found in the typical Molgulidæ. The genus *Eugyra* has probably been formed by the divergence from the main line, between E. and *Molgula*, of a form (10) in which the folds in the branchial sac had become rudimentary.
