Two new species, *Pentacrinus guettardi* and *Pentacrinus arndtii*, are mentioned here, but nothing is said as to which came from Amboina, nor as to the nature of the other. The Amboina specimen was probably a *Metacrinus*.

III.

"I learn from a correspondent at Melbourne, Mr. J. S. Poore, that during his visit to King George's Sound, Western Australia, he there dredged up from 8 fathoms a living Encrinite. The stem, which was attached to a stone, was about 6 inches long; the arms about $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch, of a beautiful rose-colour or pink, fading to white." Sir. R. Owen in *Ann. and Mag. Nat. Hist.*, ser. 3, vol. ix., 1862, p. 486.

This may perhaps have been a Pentacrinoid larva, but if so, it was of most unusual size. Further information about it from Australian naturalists would be most valuable.
